Covid-19 Precautions

Summary of Change of Procedures 3/9/21

Governor Abbott issued an Executive Order lifting certain state mandated policies effective March 10, 2021. Individual responsibility was encouraged, some regulations were assigned to be governed by the city or county authorities, and much was left to be determined by the individual business policy.

DuVall's School of Cosmetology will require the guidelines stated in this document, some of which are based on industry related guidance from TDLR.

TDLR TAKES ACTION IN RESPONSE TO COVID-19

What the Governor's Executive Order means for TDLR licensees:

- TDLR **will not** issue violations or warnings for anything involving masks or social distancing.
- For all businesses - including salons (hair and nail, esthetician, and lash), barber shops, laser hair removal facilities, massage establishments, and schools (barber, cosmetology, massage therapy, and driver education):
 - Masks and social distancing are **not required** but are **strongly encouraged**.
 - Businesses **may choose** to require employees, customers, or students to wear masks and to practice social distancing.
- In providing or obtaining services, every person is **strongly encouraged** to follow the [Texas Department of State Health Services health recommendations](#).
- Please note that counties in trauma service regions with hospitalization rates above 15% for 7 days can implement requirements that might include masks and social distancing. A list of these counties can be found [here](#).

ADD

- Masks or facial coverings will continue to be required for **all** persons entering the building – staff, students, clients, guests, service technicians, etc.
 - Clients must wear a mask at all times that the service is not impeded by the mask.
 - Shields in place of masks are only accepted with note from a medical professional explaining that the patient is unable to wear a mask.
- Children are now allowed in the building without having to be the recipient of a service.
- The lobby is now open, with limited seating.
- Clients and guests no longer need to sit in the car and call in, but may walk into the lobby, report directly to the front desk, receive a temperature check and sign a Covid Questionnaire. When cleared by the front desk, they may wait in the lobby for the student to pick them up for their service. If all seats in the lobby are filled, the client or guest must wait outside until one becomes available. If they are not able to be cleared, they must leave the building immediately and may call to reschedule their appointment.
- Students no longer need to wait outside but may enter the building and proceed to the front desk for a temperature check.
- No person may enter other parts of the building (timeclock, restrooms, clinic floor, classroom, breakroom, etc) until cleared at the front desk.
- Guidelines about persons exhibiting symptoms will continue to remain in place. Leave of Absences will continue to be available to students, we continue to observe the general rule that if you are sick, do not come to school.
- Field trip activities continue to remain suspended.
- Cosmetology stations, Esthetics beds, equipment, lobby chairs, and offices are to be disinfected after each use.
- Directional arrows and distancing markers will be removed.

All portions of the COVID-19 Operating Policies/Procedures dated October 26, 2020 not specifically addressed in this document remain in effect until further notice. Revisions and adjustments will continue to be made as deemed appropriate by the administration.
